We all know that almost 95% of burn incidences are preventable. When a child is told about anything particularly in school, not only he or she but family members, and as such community gets benefitted. So, we have given a slogan **"TEACH THEM YOUNG"** under which we are trying to reach out to the children of 6th to 8th standard which is the most receptive age. We are trying to include a chapter on BURN PREVENTION in school curriculum too. I personally have taken talks in schools and hospitals in far most regions of the country such as Ladakh. I have given interviews In LEH and KARGIL AIR and Door Darshan. These talks and interviews are helpful in spreading the awareness through these. We all can do similar things in our areas. Many of our esteemed members are already doing this.

This year initiatives have been taken to opening of SKIN BANKS in north India. Efforts for Burn registry is being made with authorities and a programme for rehabilitation of amputees is being formulated.

Approach to management of burns is now shifting from conservative management towards early intervention to close the wounds as early as possible either by auto graft or homograft / skin substitute followed by autograft once the patient is hemodynamically stable. Now a days emphasis is on addressing the psychological aspect of the patient and family both with proper rehabilitation to make the patient more acceptable and useful to the society.

This year we are starting a new modality of conducting the annual meeting of National Academy of Burns of India as per the wish of our most senior patron Dr. J. L. Gupta with the idea to spread the knowledge and awareness in all parts of the country. So, now onwards Presidentship is dissociated from the conducting the conference which is to be rotated zone wise. In fact, it has started from the last year only but we will be having the conference in physical form for the first time under this pattern. This will also encourage the esteemed members to bid along the presidentship from the same zone so that conference may be held in their zone only. This modality of holding the conference in smaller towns/ areas of the country will definitely help in spreading the awareness about burns and encourage other doctors apart from Plastic Surgeons to treat burn patients in their areas.

I also appeal you all to encourage and include more and more doctors in the management of burns. Respected Seniors and esteemed members

Greetings from the office of National Academy of Burns India.

The academy has grown over the years to reach a members strength of over 1000. Still the association is yet to take a large number of clinicians engaged in burn care in it's fold. Today a large number of clinicians are treating burns, they are not part of NABI. A sustained nation wide movement is the need of the hour to take NABI to the next level. All of us have to take this task to bring our general surgeons, intensivists and nursing colleges in the fold of the Academy. We can even start a Burn Prevention/Burn-Care Day once a year on a particular day. The mid term CME can be organised in more than once in a year as well. Moreover the Association is still not listed in the list of professional associations with Army Medical Corp.

The burn injury scenario has changed over the last decade as well. LPG/PNG has replaced kerosene as the main domestic fuel.

There is no doubt kerosene stove malfunction accidents have reduced but LPG burns are on the rise. And unlike kerosene stove mishaps LPG fire has more victims as LPG spreads widely. Many departments in the country have brought out these new trends in their studies. Recently we have seen fire in hotels and factories in congested urban areas and the most incriminating factor in them are blatant violation of fire safety norms. National Academy of Burns India must focus on these new trends.

Last year we had a very enriching conference at Mumbai with the great efforts of Dr Vinita Puri in hybrid mode (inauguration etc took place in the Fortune Park Hotel Lakecity Thane in Hybrid Mode) and happy to have record attendance that time. It was very well arranged with the efforts of the organizing team.

NABICON 2023 is going to be organized in the beautiful state Tamilnadu, at Coimbatore, under the Presidentship of Dr. R K Shrivastava, with able leadership of Dr. Raja Sabhpathy. Details of the conference are there in the NABI website. I am sure it is going to be a grand event.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

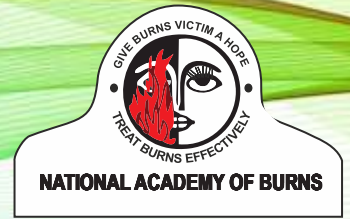

GBM Minutes held during NABICON 2021 on 22 January 2021

Opening Remarks by Dr Sameek Bhattacharya

This is the GBM of NABI for the year 2022. Dr Sanjiv Uppal, NABI President started the meeting with his opening remarks by congratulating Chairman Organizing Committee, Dr Vinita Puri, Organizing Secretary Dr Venkateshwaran Narsimha and all the members of organizing committee for to organize such a beautiful meeting which has academic contents at par with any international meeting. He also welcomes incoming president Dr R K Srivastava, Secretary Dr Sameek Bhattacharya, Treasurer Dr Shardendu Sharma, members of the executive committee, past presidents and secretaries of the association and members of NABI.

He felt honored to be the president of the this August association on the occasion of 29th Annual Conference at this financial capital of India (Mumbai). This Conference was supposed to be held at Goa and then Mumbai as a physical meeting but due to Corona pandemic it was forced to postpone the physical meeting and carry on to the virtual meeting. But virtual meeting is functioning as good as any physical meeting.

DR Uppal mentioned that in 1990 as resident in plastic surgery dept. there are huge changes since then. Progress in this field not only on national front by our Indian people, but also internationally as far as plastic surgery and burns are concerned. We are sure that the burns surgeons across the globe they listen to us with conviction now and many of them follow our innovation and techniques.

Still there are several burn centers across India which are managing phenomenal amount of burns workload with meager resources, lack of trade manpower & poor backup facilities that lead to high morbidity and mortality. The training of the paramedical personnel, nurses and technical staff should be made priority that if they want to come out with the good result along with our medical staff and even the doctors at various places viz district, tehsil levels or nursing homes

The acid sales though legally banned in India and punishable upto life imprisonment which has deterred acid attacks, but still heinous crime continues. It is our duty, along with the academics, to propagate against the acid attacks.

He also added that due to Corona, the exchange of knowledge could not be done through seminars, CMEs, Conference, so there was idea of webinars came up and the same was put in NABI Executive council and agreed by them.

A quiz is introduced in NABICON, having a prize money for the winners, the fund has been spared by Nabicon 2020.

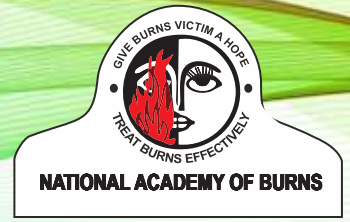

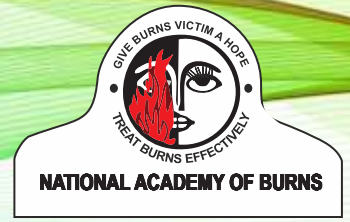

Matter Arising out of EC Meeting

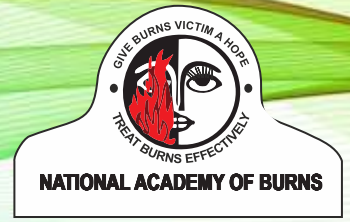
- a. All corpus FD are collated under the head HO, fund since 2011.

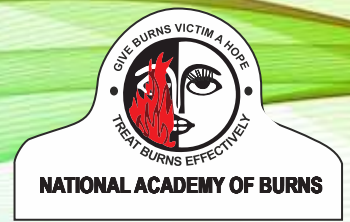
BURN CENTER AT AIIMS BHUBHNEHWAR

The burn centre was inaugurated on 7th January 2023 by Hon'ble Union Minister Dr Manuskh Mandaviya, Minister of Health & Family Welfare and Chemicals & Fertilizers , Govt of India in the August presence of Hon'ble Union Minister Dr Dharmendra Pradhan, Minister of Education & Skill Development & Enterprenuership , Hon'ble Union Minister of State, Dr Bharti Pravin Pawar, Minister of Health & Family Welfare and Smt. Aparajita Sarangi , Member of Parliament (LS) Bhubneshwar.

This Burns centre is a 36 bedded state of the art structure which is well specialized with modern amenities. It is well equipped with red zone, green zone, laser room, burn bath, hyperbaric oxygen chamber, radiology and pathology area on the ground floor. The first floor is exclusively a sterile zone with one functional modular OT and another under construction along with pre-op and post-op areas and 6 ICU beds. The second floor has 16 bedded ward, 6 cabins, 1 dressing room. The third floor has provision to accommodate social counselling room, dietician, physiotherapy, tele-conference seminar hall connecting all district hospitals of Odisha and all state hospitals of India. We also plan to expand this with a skin banking facility.

The burn centre is funded by CSR initiative of NTPC.





Paramedics are the first & major contact point for burn patients.

Every hospital or burn centre or nursing home does burn dressing differently.

There is a 'Need for standardization of burn dressing procedures' in India

NABI with CSR initiative of Sun pharma has launched a unique educational initiative for paramedics doing burn dressings.

Program Objective:

SPARSH program is for all paramedics doing burn patient dressing to sharpen their knowledge and skills. This training program is intended to bring standardization in burn dressings for better patient outcomes in burn management.

Program Details:

- This training program will be for 30-45 minutes.
- The program consists of a presentation talk of 20-25 minutes followed by burn dressing video.
- The burn dressing video has been made in 13 languages (including 12 regional languages)
- There will be evaluation of the paramedics before and after the program with a digital assessment questionnaire consisting of 20 questions.
- Every paramedic will be certified from NABI on successful completion of the program with minimum 80% score (16 out of 20 questions to be answered correctly).

Significant improvement in standardisation of burn dressing



NABICON 21-22 (VIRTUAL) REPORT

The 29th Annual Conference of the National Academy of Burns India (NABICON 21-22) was conducted in a virtual format from the 21st to 23rd of January 2022 under the presidency of Dr Sanjeev Uppal and with Dr Vinita Puri as the Organising Chairperson. The conference was scheduled to be held in March 2021 at Goa but had to be postponed due to the pandemic. Subsequent efforts to hold a hybrid meeting were thwarted by resurgence of waves of the covid pandemic. 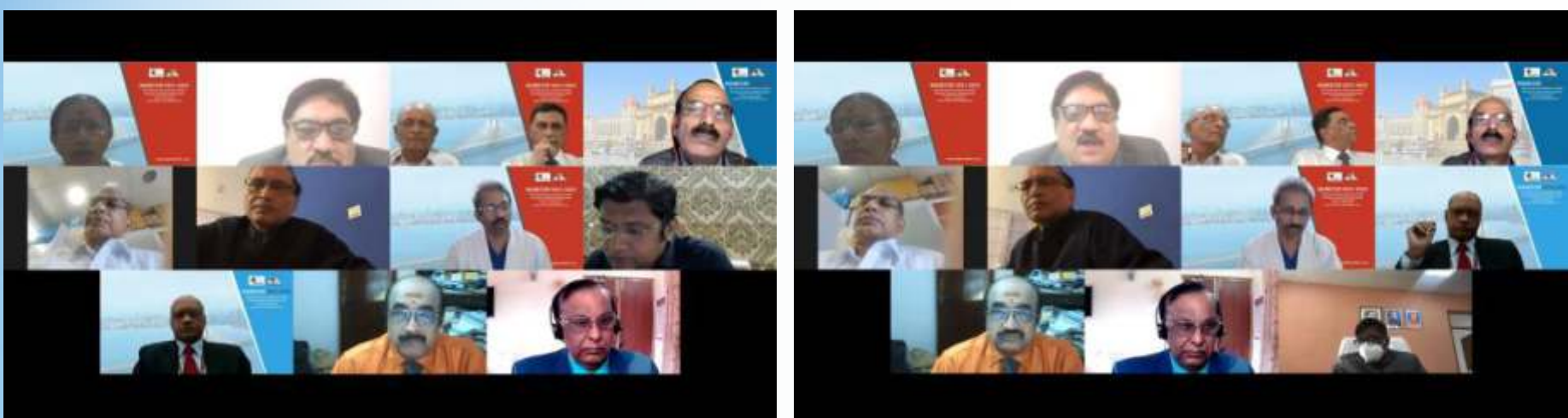

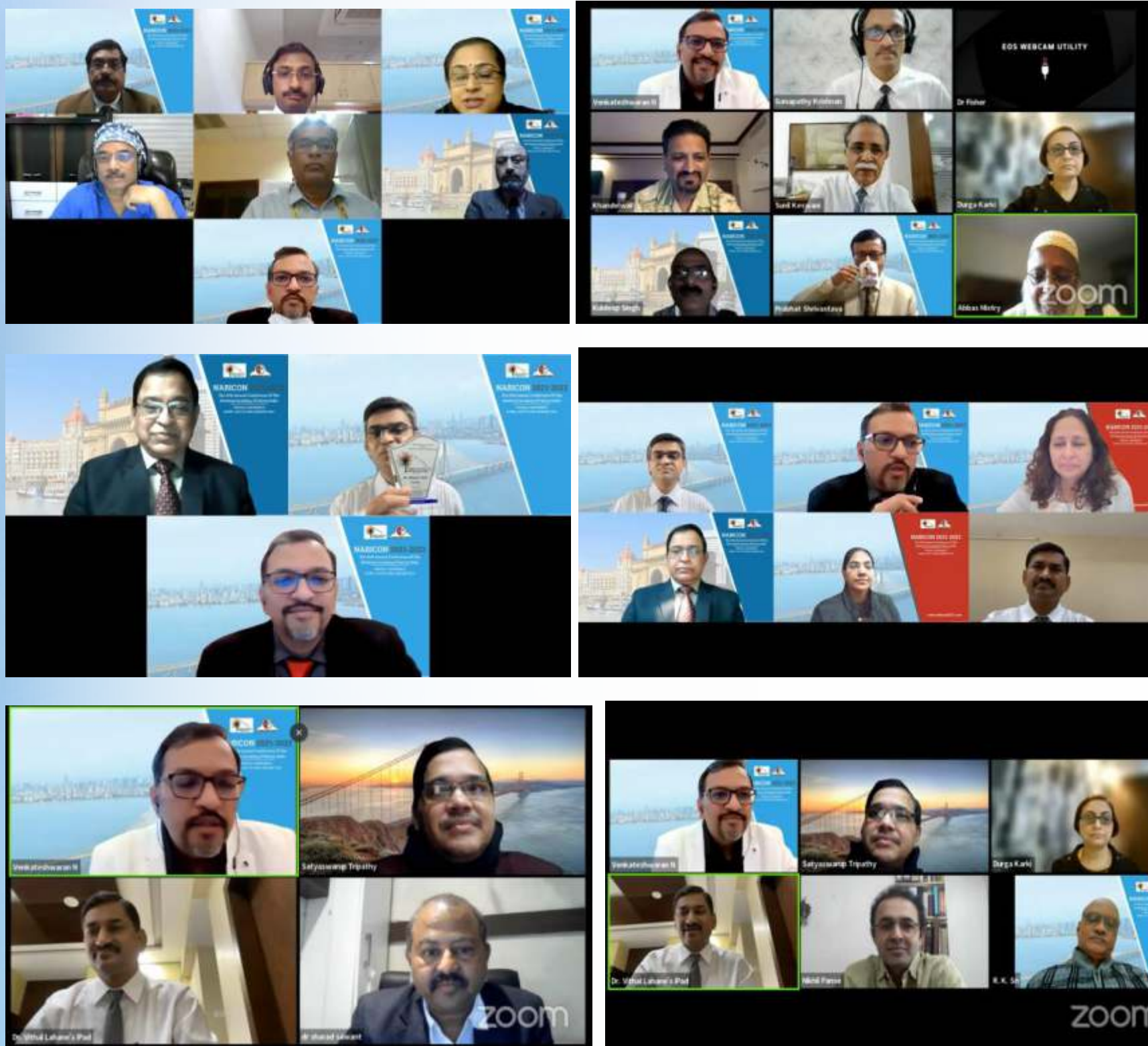

QUIZ

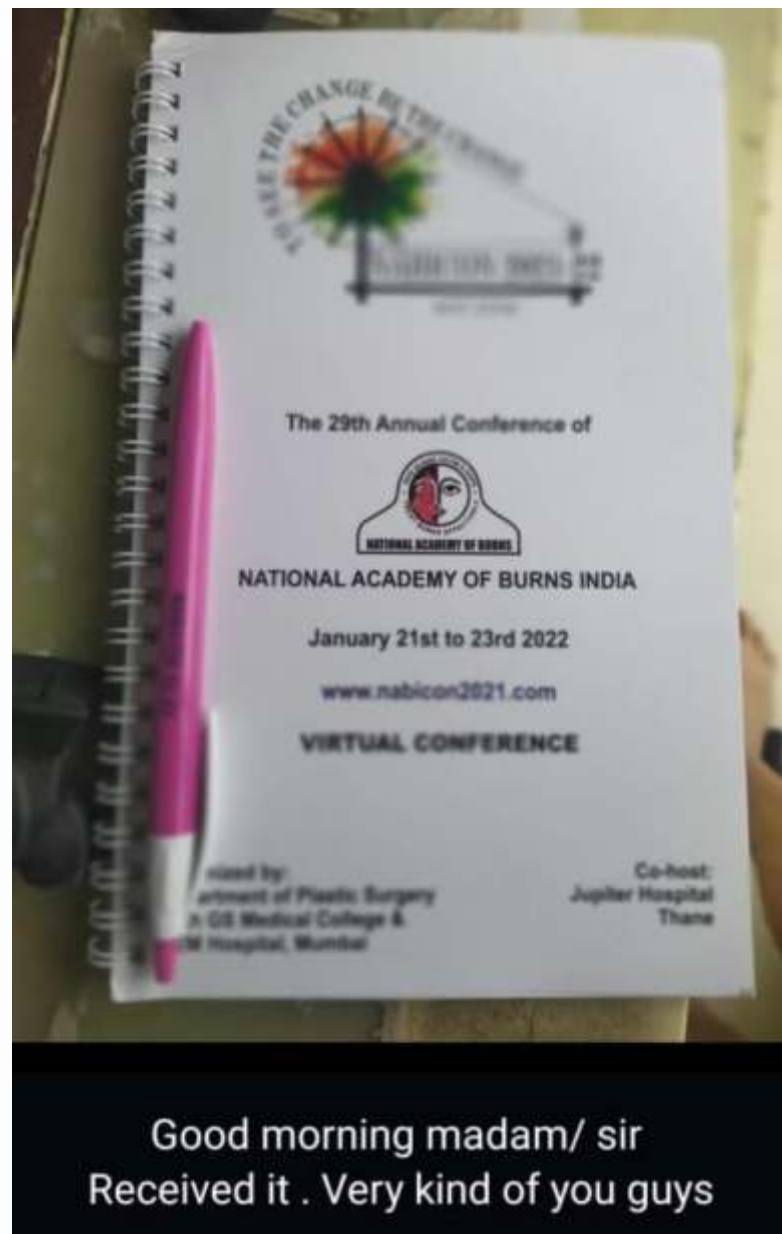

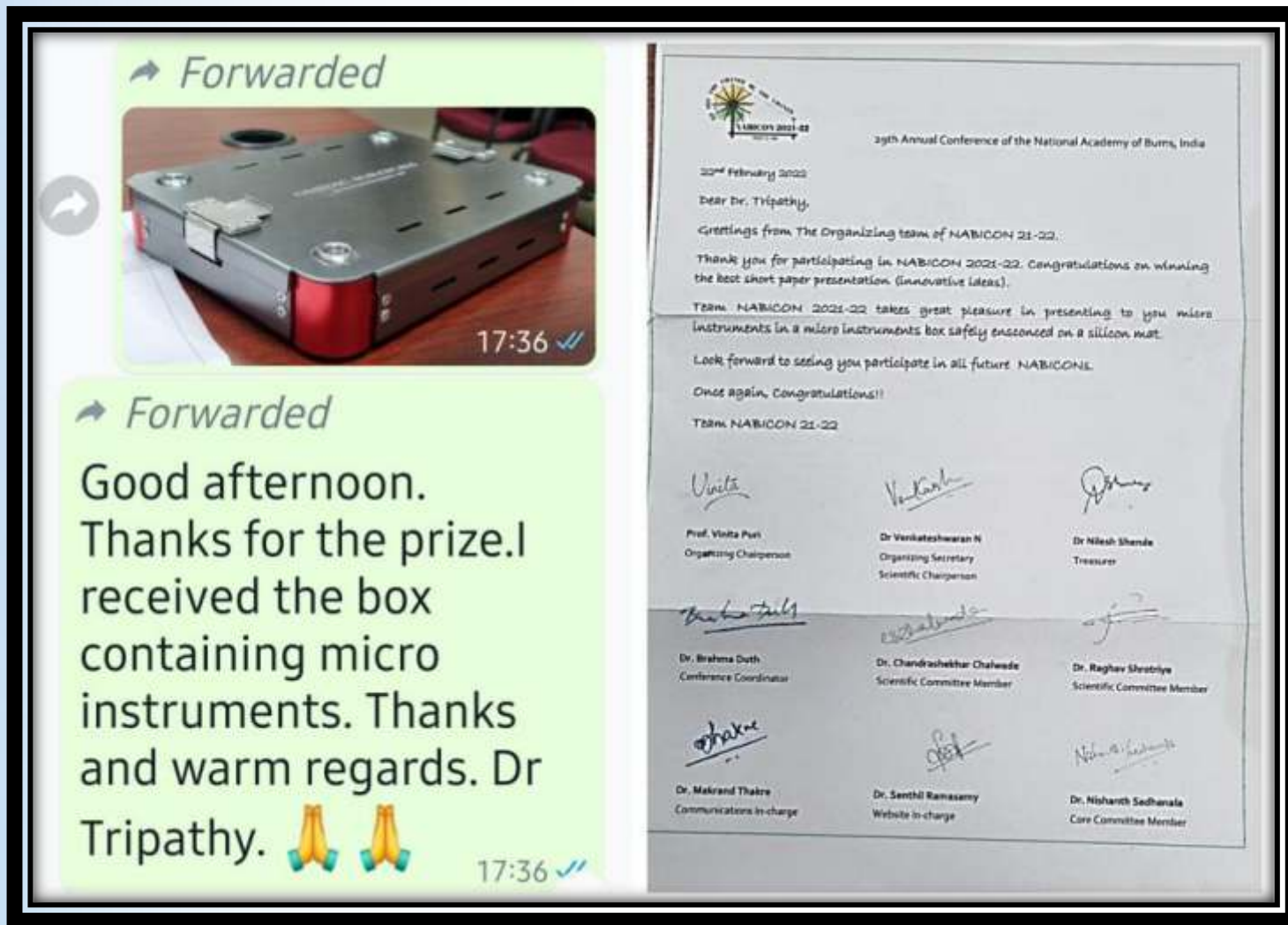

Prizes sent for the awards announced during valedictory

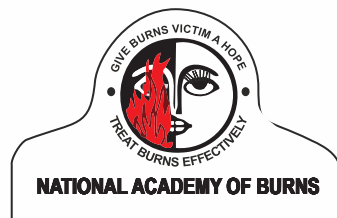

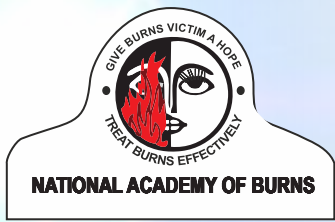

REPORT OF THE NATIONAL ACADEMY OF BURNS INDIA MID TERM MEETING HELD AT LUCKNOW FROM 6-7 NOVEMBER 2021

The National Academy of Burns India (NABI) mid-term CME was held from November 6-7, 2021 at Hotel Gemini Continental, Lucknow. The CME was organised by the Department of Plastic Surgery and Burns, SGPGIMS, Lucknow with Dr. Rajiv Agarwal as the organising chairman.

The meeting was held in hybrid mode over a period of two days. It was attended by a large number of participants both in physical and online mode. It was attended physically by local plastic surgeons and invited faculty. The national invited faculty who graced by their presence included Dr. Sanjeev Uppal, Dr. Prabhat Shrivastava, Dr. Brijesh Mishra and Dr. Veena Singh. The national faculty who participated online included Dr. Vinita Puri, Dr. Shalabh Kumar, Dr. SM Keswani, Dr. Pradeep Jain, Dr. Maneesh Singhal and Dr. Anant Sinha who gave video presentations in the CME.

The international faculty included Dr. Mark Fisher a leading burn surgeon from USA who presented several videos on reconstruction of axillary contracture, management of ulnar nerve compression and treatment of hand contractures. Dr. Anjay Khandelwal from USA made presentation on how to save severely burn patients. Dr. Goran Zovic from Zambia spoke on “utreach plastic and reconstructive surgery in Zambia” In addition to this several national faculty including Dr. Keswani from National Burns Centre gave presentations on release of axillary and other contractures, Dr. Vinita Puri from Mumbai talked about splinting and avoiding contractures in burns, Dr. Shalabh Kumar from Safdarjung Hospital spoke on the salient points in the management of burns, Dr. Prabhat Shrivastava spoke at length on the fluid management in burns, Dr. Maneesh Singhal spoke on emergency management of burns, Dr Veena Singh from AIIMS Patna spoke on role of biodegradable temporising matrix, Dr. Brijesh Mishra spoke on the new burn centre at KGMU and Dr. Rajiv Agarwal spoke on role of integra in burns.

The meeting was inaugurated by Director SGPGI, Prof. R.K Dhiman and the inaugural function was graced by the presence of NABI president Dr. Sanjeev Uppal.

A booklet on first aid in burns was released by the Honourable director, SGPGIMS, Prof. R.K Dhiman. This booklet describes the initial steps in the management of acute burns. This booklet was printed and widely distributed to local surgeons, public and at schools. A press conference was also organised before the start of the CME to apprise the media and the public about the recent developments in the area of burns. Burn cases: Docs told about latest trends, basic steps

Director of Sanjay Gandhi Post-Graduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Prof RK Dhiman inaugurated a continuig medical education (CME) organised by the Plastic Surgery department on Saturday. The aim was to educate the medical practitioners dealing with cases of burns about the latest trends and basic steps.

A booklet on first aid in burns was released by Prof Dhiman. The booklet describes the initial steps in the management of acute burns.

Dr Rajiv Agarwal from the Plastic Surgery department, the organising chairman of this CME, spoke on the role of integra in burns and treatment of absent nipple and areola in burns. Dr Sanjeev Uppal from Ludhiana was the guest of honour at the inaugural programme.

At a press conference before the inauguration of the CME, Dr Agarwal said the National Academy of Burns, India, also known as NABI, is a central body of professionals dedicated to the cause of prevention, early treatment, early rehabilitation, teaching and research in burns.

"NABI was established initially by a handful of dedicated burn surgeons and it rapidly grew to now having more than 1,200 life members. It welcomes professionals who are associated with any aspect of providing comprehensive burn care.

Physicians, nurses, nutritionists, burn dressers, occupational therapists, dieticians and social

workers are all eligible to become life members of this association," he said.

"It is a very common problem in our country and every medical practitioner of any specialty has seen and treated patients of burns. On an average, about 7 million people get burns every year and 1.5 to 2 lakf of them die or get crippled due to the severity of burns. Burns are on the rise in India due to illiteracy and poverty as people are not aware of the safe practices for cooking," he pointed out.

He said specialised centres for treatment of burns are few in the country, considering the large number of patients suffering from burn deformities.

"Most of the centres exist in metro cities and very few are in smaller cities. The number of plastic surgeons is also disproportionate. It is clear that the vast majority of burn patients do not reach plastic surgeons and are treated by general surgeons and practitioners. This CME is being organised from November 6-7. Several leading national and faculties are giving presentations in the form of operative videos," he said.

Dr Mark Fisher, a leading burn surgeon from the USA, will be speaking on the reconstruction of axillary contracture, management of ulnar nerve compression and treatment of hand contractures.

Dr Anjay Khandelwal from the USA will speak on how to save severely burnt patients. Dr Goran Zovic from Zambia will be speaking on burn surgery.

है। इस बैंक के बनने के बाद नेत्रदान की तरह ही स्किन डोनेशन भी शुरू किया जा सकेगा। हालांकि इसे रखने में काफी सावधानी बरतनी पड़ती है।

एक व्यक्ति से मिले स्किन से आठ लोगों को राहत दी जा सकती है। अभी तक जहां आर्टिफिशियल स्किन लगाने में दो इंच का करीब 25 हजार रुपया खर्च होता है और इसके प्रतिकूल प्रभाव का भी खतरा बना रहता है वहीं स्किन बैंक होने से उसके रखरखाव पर करीब 15 हजार खर्च होंगे। डॉ. अग्रवाल ने बताया कि एसजीपीजीआई में करीब 40 एसिड पीड़ितों का उपचार किया गया है। संस्थान में विभिन्न अस्पतालों से रेफर होकर मरीज आते हैं। ऐसे में मार्डन बर्न यूनिट की जरूरत है, जिसके लिए प्रयास चल रहा है। सफदरजंग

घाव भरने पर भी नारियल तेल लगाएं

एम्स पटना की डॉ. वीना सिंह ने बताया कि बर्न के केस में घाव ऊपर से भर जाने के बाद भी आंतरिक घाव बना रहता है। इससे उसमें खुजली ज्यादा होती है। ऐसे में नारियल तेल लगाना चाहिए। घाव भरने के बाद भी दो साल तक विशेष देखभाल की जरूरत होती है।

झुलसने पर 15 मिनट पानी में रखें

डॉ. संजीव उत्पल ने बताया कि झुलने पर संबंधित अंग पर टूथपेस्ट, स्याही या अन्य कोई भी चीज नहीं लगानी चाहिए। संबंधित अंग को 15 मिनट तक पानी में रखें। इससे आंतरिक घाव नहीं होगा। उन्होंने बताया कि झुलसने के बाद चमड़ी आने पर संबंधित स्थल पर मोटी खाल सी दिखती है। इसे खत्म करने के लिए लेजर तकनीक का सहारा लिया जा रहा है। इसी तरह विदेशों में स्किन स्प्रे का चलन है। इसमें कांख के पास की स्किन लेकर उसका कल्चर करते हैं और फिर स्प्रे तैयार करते हैं। इस स्प्रे को झुलसे हिस्से पर डाला जाता है। धीरे-धीरे स्किन ग्रो करने लगती है।

जले हिस्से पर स्किन स्प्रे गन से उगेगी त्वचा



नेशनल एकेडमी ऑफ बर्न्स इंडिया की कॉन्फ्रेंस में विशेषज्ञों ने बर्न के इलाज की नई तकनीक के बारे में बताया।

■ एनबीटी संवाददाता, लखनऊ : स्प्रे गन पेंटिंग की तरह अब शरीर के जले हिस्सों पर ऊतक का स्प्रे कर नई त्वचा उगाई जा सकती है। बर्न के इलाज की इस नई तकनीक का देश में भी उपयोग शुरू हो गया है। इसमें मरीज की साफ त्वचा लेकर लैब में कल्चर कर इसका लिक्विड एरोसोल बनाया जाता है। फिर स्प्रे गन से शरीर के जले हिस्से पर इसे स्प्रे करते हैं। इसके बाद 21 दिन में जले हिस्से पर त्वचा की नई परत आ जाती है।

नेशनल एकेडमी ऑफ बर्न्स इंडिया की ओर से शनिवार को हजरतगंज के एक होटल में हुई राष्ट्रीय कॉन्फ्रेंस में पीजीआई के प्लास्टिक सर्जन डॉ. राजीव अग्रवाल ने स्प्रे गन तकनीक के बारे में बताया। असोसिएशन के अध्यक्ष डॉ. संजीव उत्पल ने बताया कि स्किन स्प्रे तकनीक से त्वचा के एक वर्ग सेंटीमीटर टुकड़े को कल्चर कर इतने सेल बन सकते हैं, जिनसे एक वर्ग मीटर तक की त्वचा उगाई जा सकती है।

गरीबों के लिए राहत है स्किन बैंक : कॉन्फ्रेंस में एम्स पटना के प्लास्टिक सर्जरी विभाग की हेड डॉ. वीना सिंह ने बताया कि किसी की मृत्यु के बाद आंख और दूसरे अंगों की तरह त्वचा भी डोनेट की जा सकती है। ऐसे में स्किन बैंक बर्न के मरीजों के लिए बरदान है, हालांकि अभी किसी भी सरकारी संस्थान में इसकी सुविधा नहीं है। देश में 14 संस्थानों में स्किन बैंक शुरू हो गया है, लेकिन ये सभी निजी संस्थान हैं। अगर किसी मरीज को आर्टिफिशियल स्किन लगाते हैं तो दो वर्ग इंच का टुकड़ा 25 हजार रुपये का पड़ता है। इसके उलट स्किन बैंक से लेने पर प्रोसेसिंग फीस भी मिला लें तो 100 रुपये से ज्यादा लागत नहीं आती।

जलना क्या है

जलना एक चोट या दुर्घटना है जो आग, गर्म तरल पदार्थ, बिजली, गर्म भाप, गर्म धुआँ, गर्म धातु, पटाखे व विस्फोटक सामान आदि कारणों से हो सकती है। जलने से चमड़ी, मांस पेशियां, कोशिकाएं, नसें इत्यादि भी क्षतिग्रस्त हो सकती हैं। जलने से गंभीर पीड़ा के अलावा शारीरिक विकृति, मानसिक एवं भावनात्मक परिणाम भी हो सकते हैं।

जलने के कारण



स्टोव- आमतौर पर स्टोव फटने से व तेल लीक होने से आग लग सकती है।



सिलेण्डर- गैस पाइप के कटे-फटे होने और रेग्युलेटर के ठीक से फिट न होने के कारण गैस सिलेण्डर के फटने से आग लग सकती है।



डिबरी- खाली शीशी/डिब्बी में तेल और बत्ती डालकर घर में बनी डिबरी आग लगने का आम कारण है।



गर्म तरल पदार्थ से जलना- गर्म चाय/उबलता पानी/तेल/दूध/सूप आदि।



गर्म भाप- प्रेशर कुकर की भाप/बायलर से निकलने वाली भाप/भाप लेने वाली मशीन आदि।



बिजली- दोषपूर्ण तार, ढीले कनेक्शन/बिजली के खुले पाइंट या स्विच आदि।



रसायनों के कारण- रसायनिक कारखानों, विद्यालयों की प्रयोगशालाएं आदि।



गर्म धातु- प्रैस/कढ़ाई/पतीला आदि गलती से छूने पर त्वचा जल सकती है।

जलने से बचाव - घर में

स्टोव व गैस के चूल्हे का सही रख-रखाव



- हमेशा आई.एस.आई. मार्क वाले स्टोव/गैस चूल्हा प्रयोग करें।
- गैस सिलेण्डर को हमेशा सीधी स्थिति में खड़ा रखें।
- रबड़ की ट्यूब हर 3 से 4 माह में बदलें।
- ट्यूब का किनारा यदि खराब हो जाए तो उसे काट कर पुनः इस्तेमाल करें।
- गैस के चूल्हे का उपयोग नह हो तो रेगुलेटर बंद रखें।
- गैस के बर्नर की नियमित सफाई करें।

रोशनी के स्थानीय उपकरणों का ध्यान रखें

कभी भी रोशनी के लिए खतरनाक उपकरणों जैसे दीया आदि का प्रयोग न करें क्योंकि इनसे आग लगने का खतरा रहता है।



हमेशा लैम्प, दीया, मोमबत्ती, लालटेन आदि को बच्चों की पहुँच से दूर, ऊँचाई पर रखें।

ज्वलनशील पदार्थ जैसे मिट्टी का तेल, माचिस इत्यादि जलते हुए लैम्प से दूर रखें।



नियमित रूप से लैम्प/लालटेन की सफाई एवं रख-रखाव करें।

हमेशा रोशनी करने वाले सभी उपकरण जैसे लैम्प, दीया आदि को पर्दों से दूर रखें।



जलने से रहें सावधान

कभी भी ढीले-ढाले सिन्थेटिक कपड़े पहन कर खाना न बनाएं एवं चुन्नी/साड़ी के पल्लू को बांधकर ही काम करें।

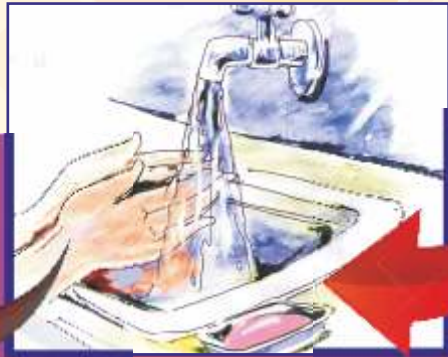

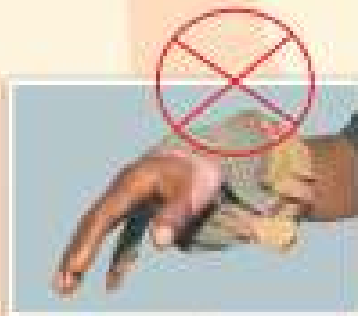

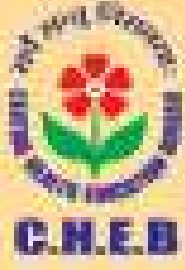

Do's



- Always keep the cooking stove on a raised platform.
- Keep Matches/ Candles/ *Diya*/ Inflammables out of reach of children.
- Check temperature of the water for bath especially in case of children.
- Unplug all electrical gadgets when not in use and put off the switches.
- Use only ISI marked standard quality electric wires.

Don'ts



- ⊘ Do not wear synthetic, overhanging/ loose clothes while cooking.
- ⊘ Do not let children play with electric gadgets matches, candles, lamps, fire etc.
- ⊘ Do not hold a child while smoking/ drinking hot liquids
- ⊘ Do not overload electric sockets.
- ⊘ Do not smoke in bed.
- ⊘ Do not throw a burning Bidi/ Cigarette anywhere.
- ⊘ Do not sleep in the room with Electric Heaters/ Lamps, Candles on.



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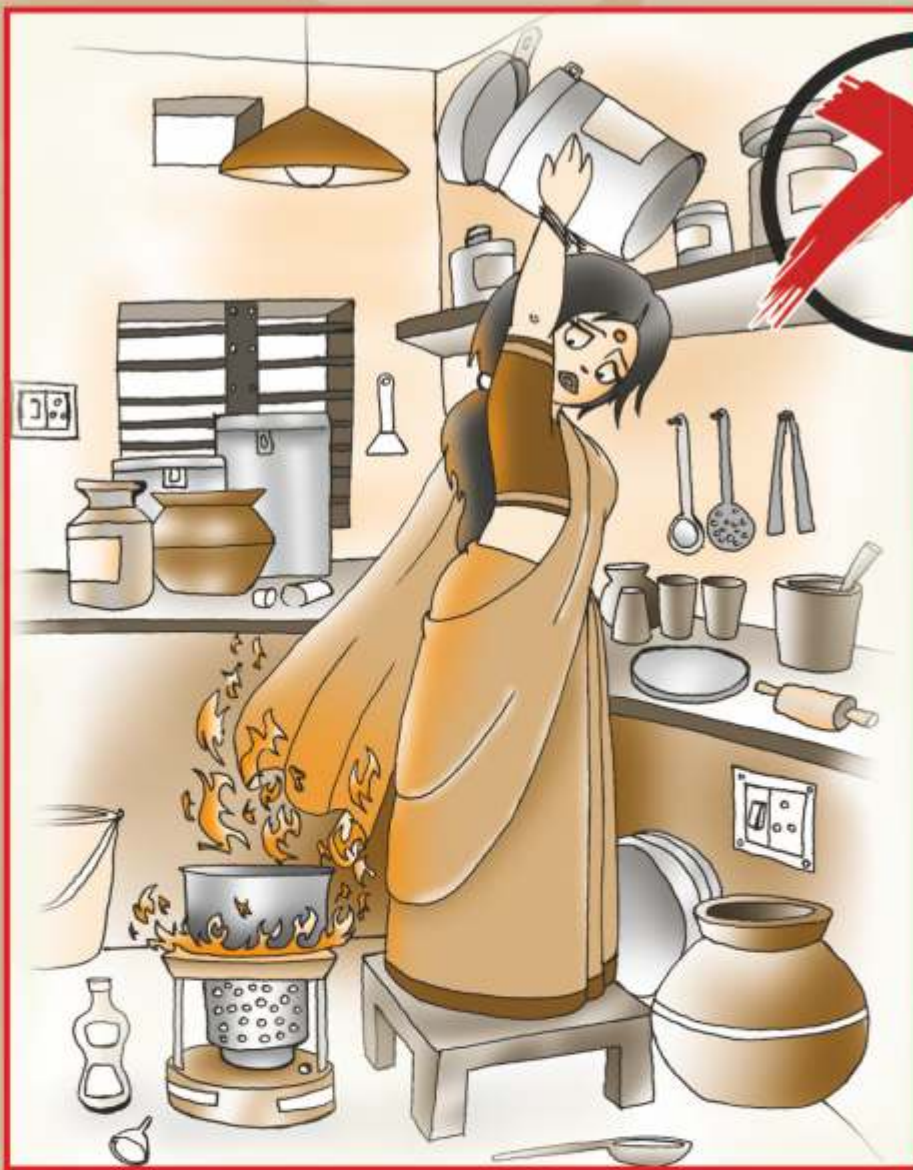

Do's

- Light fireworks/ crackers only in open grounds/ outdoors.
- Buy good quality fireworks from authorized dealers only.
- Light only one firework at a time and watch from a safe distance.
- Keep 2 buckets of water and / or sand ready while igniting fireworks.
- Children should light fireworks only in the presence of elders.



Don'ts



- ⊘ Never use fireworks inside the house.
- ⊘ Do not ignite fireworks while holding them in your hand.
- ⊘ Do not bend on an ignited firecracker.
- ⊘ Do not touch a misfired or half-burnt cracker.
- ⊘ Do not allow small children to handle fireworks/ cracker.
- ⊘ Do not burn fireworks while pointing at other people.
- ⊘ Do not light firecracker in narrow lanes.

DO NOT PANIC ON ACID BURNS

Immediately pour water on the area affected with acid/chemical. Keep the flow of water slow & do not splash water on the victim



OR



If possible remove clothing or jewellery contaminated by the acid/chemical before pouring water, with gloves or clean cloth etc



Continue the above process for 10-20 minutes or till burning sensations subside



Shift the patient immediately to the nearest health center



Wash your hands thoroughly after taking care of the patient



Wrap the burnt area loosely with a clean cloth

Always ensure that the water falling from the acid burnt area does not go to yourself or the unaffected areas of the body of the victim
