President's Message



Dear NABI members,

The National Academy of Burns - India (NABI) is a premier organization committed to improving burn care, enhancing its management, and promoting burn prevention across the country. It has been a privilege to serve as its President and witness the collective efforts made by its members in shaping the future of burn care in India.

In line with NABI vision, several important initiatives have been undertaken during the year and I am pleased to share the progress made.

➤ Only one Mid-term CME used to be conducted annually under the aegis of NABI. However, from this year onwards, it was decided to expand this measure, and accordingly, six meetings with CME sessions were conducted across all the six zones of our country (listed below) with active support and participation of our esteemed NABI members to ensure nationwide coverage.

Patna, Bihar | Guwahati, Assam | Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh | Latur, Maharashtra | Mumbai, Maharashtra | Puducherry

These meetings helped in highlighting the importance of uniform burn care protocols and address the present gaps and variation in treatment practices. Through the CME sessions, experts from diverse regions exchanged experiences and practical knowledge on key aspects of burn care, including acute burns management, post-burn deformities, rehabilitation and long-term follow-up. Details of all the events, along with photographs, have been duly updated in the NABI's newsletter as well as on the official NABI website.

➤ The official NABI website has been updated to reflect the accurate and current number of recognized burn units (i.e. 81) and Skin Banks across the country, including newly established facilities.

➤ Thirty-Four new skin banks have been established nationwide. Members of NABI have played a significant role in this initiative by actively promoting awareness regarding the importance of skin donation.

➤ Under the "National Programme for Prevention and management of Burns & Trauma Injuries" of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare:

- Uniform guidelines for treatment of burns patients have been developed in close collaboration between VMMC & Safdarjung Hospital, AIIMS, New Delhi and ABVIMS & Dr. RML Hospital.

These guidelines aim to bring consistency across all burn units and practitioners in the country so that every burn patient receives timely, appropriate and high-quality care. This initiative marks a significant step towards strengthening the burns care services nationwide. These guidelines will be disseminated to all the esteemed NABI members for uniform implementation across the country.

- Fourteen burn units across the country have been nominated as Centre of Excellence (COEs). These nominated units are organizing training programmes for doctors, medical students, nursing personnel, general public and supporting staff, focussing on burn prevention, first aid, management and other critical aspects of burn care. I believe that this endeavour will significantly contribute to reducing the incidence of burns injuries as well as associated morbidity and mortality.

- Information, Education and Communication (IEC) material has been developed by VMMC & Safdarjung Hospital under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) Centre of Excellence initiative. It has been disseminated to various burn units across the country to spread awareness among the masses about hazards associated with fire-related incidents and to educate on preventive and safety measures.

The 33rd Annual Conference of the National Academy of Burns – India (NABICON 2026) will be held at the India Habitat Centre, New Delhi from 27th February 2026 to 01st March 2026. Its theme is "Healing Beyond Burns – Elevating standards and transforming lives". It reflects our shared commitment to not only saving lives but also restoring function, confidence and quality of life for every burn survivor.

Burns treatment is inherently multidisciplinary. True healing requires not only immediate medical treatment but also long-term rehabilitation and restoration of function, appearance and confidence. In view of this, the NABICON 2026 features delegates from multiple professional groups which include burn specialists, plastic surgeons, physiotherapists, nursing professionals and medical students.

➤ With deep respect and special appreciation for the vital role of nursing professions in burn care, the first day of the conference, i.e. 27.02.2025, has been dedicated exclusively to the nurses training. Nurses from various institutions across the country have been invited to participate, and their involvement will directly contribute to improved patient outcomes.

NABICON 2026 serves as a platform for learning, collaboration and renewed commitment. The conference promises a focused and comprehensive scientific program, featuring lectures, symposia, debates on ongoing controversies and insightful "How I do it" sessions.

I look forward to meeting you all at the conference. I sincerely hope that the scientific sessions, workshops and discussions ahead will be professionally enriching and inspire us to continue working with dedication for the well-being of burn patients across India.

Greetings from New Delhi! After a long time NABICON is being organized in the National Capital and we all must attend in good numbers. I am sure the organising team led by our President Dr. Sujata Sarabahi is going to make the Conference a grand and memorable academic event.

Recently Central Government has taken pertinent steps to improve burn care in the country.

The DGHS, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has released the "Standard Treatment Guidelines for Management Burns". It is an extensively researched and structured document with hierarchical care protocol starting from PHCs to tertiary care burn units. It has contributions from our President Dr. Sujata Sarabahi, myself and Dr. Manish Singhal, HOD dept of Plastic Surgery, AIIMS. You can download it from our website www.thenabi.org

All members are requested to share the documents in your institution and also percolate down to Primary Health Center level.

The National Program of Trauma and Burns, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, for the last two years, have been training surgeons and anesthetists across the country in burn and trauma management. Members in government institutions may ask doctors and nurses of their institutes to avail of this 7 day training program, being conducted in Delhi in RML hospital and Safdarjung Hospital.

It's very heartening that now we will have multiple burn CMEs across the country and effort should be made to train surgeons, doctors and nurses from remote areas on burn care.

The last year has seen a lot of changes at the organisational level of NABI, with the new Secretary Dr. Smitha Segu, Treasurer Dr. Ankur Bhatnagar and Editor Dr. Sanjay Giri assuming office. And they all have worked with full throttle to put the Association in order by transferring the office and the accounts.

I would like to sign off with some questions to ponder.

Is burn still a burning issue? If yes, how many general surgeons or plastic surgeons passing out of premium institutions are treating burns? How many are taking burns as a career option? How many critical care specialists are involved in burn care? How many general surgeons become NABI members? How many plastic surgeons become NABI members?

Is burns still getting enough time slots in surgery, plastic surgery and trauma conferences. Are there enough publications in the realm of burns in surgery, plastic surgery and trauma journals? How many research on burns are being funded by funding agencies? How many burn prevention IEC (Information, Education & Communication) material do we see around us? We the members of NABI must introspect on these issues. Is it not the time we develop Burns as a speciality in order to maintain high standards of burn care in the country.

At the end I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the august body for choosing me as the President Elect.

Editor's Report

Two issues were published in the year 2025, Volume-31, Issue-1 (Jan-Dec 2023) & Volume-32 Issue 1 Jan-Dec 2024) and hard copy sent by post to all NABI members. The issue Volume 33, Issue 1 (Jan-Dec 2025) went online and hard copy will dispatch very shortly.

The articles were categorised under different headings – Editorial, Original article and case report. Each article was peer reviewed by multiple reviewers.

We printed around 1200 copies. Out of which DTDC delivered-785, DTDC returned- 160 and 239 were sent through ordinary post. People who have not received their journal are requested to email me to check if their names figure in the mailing list or in the inactive list. I also request all members to send me an email on drsanjungiri@gmail.com and inform me about their email address, cell phone number as well as change in address.

The journal web address continues to be www.ijburns.com and articles can be submitted at www.journalonweb.com/ijb. The journal continues to be open access online, having improving National and Global visibility of the articles. Since the issue has been released online in Dec, it has been viewed about 4500 times with an electronic manuscript submission process, authors and reviewers are able to keep track of all articles online.

Journal performance;

We received 48 submissions in 2023 out of these 28 were accepted, 8 rejected and 12 under review. In 2024 we received 25 submissions. Out of these 16 accepted and 9 under review. In the year 2025 we received 31 submission. Out of these 17 were accepted, 03 rejected and 11 are under review. This does shows our commitment to quality control and strict scrutiny for content and evidence.

News on the Indexing front:

The journal is registered with the following abstracting partners: Baidu Scholar, CNKI (China National Knowledge Infrastructure), EBSCO Publishing's Electronic Databases, Ex Libris – Primo Central, Google Scholar, Hinari, Infotrieve, National Science Library, ProQuest, TDNet, Wanfang Data.

The Journal is indexed with DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals). We are presently working towards PMC (Pubmed) indexing.

Issues that we would like to improve on:

Journal continues to receive inadequate articles. It is a request to all delegates and Faculty to submit their work to the IJB. All articles are peer reviewed. We need to increase our citations too as that will help us to receive PMC Indexing. It is only we who can bring up our Journal.

I would like to thank to the companies who have advertised in our Journal for supporting the Journal. I would like to offer my heartfelt thanks to all the authors and reviewers who have taken the effort to sincerely review and make suggestions to improve the articles.

Above all, I would like to thank my previous Editor-in-Chief Dr Vijay Kumar who has helped me continuously in my Editorial Duties.

Visited Royal Adelaide Hospital, Australia, to explore potential collaboration opportunities with AIIMS Bhubaneswar in advancing research and development aimed at improving survival outcomes for burn patients.

NABICON 2024 – Ranchi

The 31st National Academy of burns of India conference (NABICON) 2024 was held at Ranchi at the sprawling green lawns of JSCA stadium(Country club resort). It began with a pre-conference dinner on the 14th evening and 15th, 16th, 17th of February of all those activities.

This year we have continued the process of consolidation of Funds as per the GB decisions and also worked on to develop a fund for the Journal. This year we could accomplish the KYC compliance for all our 5 accounts SBI, Canara Bank, IDBI Bank, Franklin Templeton Mutual Fund & HDFC mutual fund.



Annual General Meeting held in Ayodhya 2025


The Annual Conference of the National Academy of Burns India NABICON 2025 was organised at the holy city of Ayodhya from 13th to 15th February 2025, under the presidentship of Dr. Raja Sabapathy, with Dr. Vijay Kumar as organising chairperson. It was organised by the department of plastic surgery, King George's Medical University, Lucknow in collaboration with the department of surgery, Raja Dashrath Autonomous Medical College, Ayodhya. The conference was organised to coincide with the Mahakumbh festival in nearby Prayagraj, thus giving the delegates an opportunity to visit the Kumbh festival and the Ram Temple at Ayodhya, in addition to the academic festivity of the NABICON.

The conference was attended by about 180 delegates, including surgeons, critical care specialists, anaesthetists, paediatricians, nurses and physiotherapists. The conference lasted for three days with two halls and parallel sessions of critical care specialists, nursing and physiotherapists. It was our proud privilege to host delegate from around the world. Dr. Naiem Moimen, Past president of the International Society of Burn Injuries, delivered the presidential oration, Dr. Anjay Khandelwal from Ohio, USA, delivered the Lok Nayak Oration, Dr Sujata Sarabhai the "Phoolan Devi Gupta" oration, Dr. Ramakant Bemde the Safdarjung oration and Dr. Anat Sinha the Past President oration. Dr. Jorge Leon Villapalos, Dr. Joanne Lloyd, Dr. Yvonne Wilson from the United Kingdom, and Dr. Marcus Wagstaff from Australia were the eminent overseas delegates.

The scientific sessions covered the whole gambit of burns care, both acute and its sequelae. The highlight of the program were the discussions on acute burn resuscitation and sepsis. These topics, covered in the form of panel discussions, had a mixture of both surgeons and critical care specialists, each bringing their unique perspective to the table. The 'Kaun Banega Burns Champion' quiz program, held under the guidance of Dr. Sanjeev Uppal, by Dr. Veena Singh and Dr. Parmod Kumar, was a huge hit. The team from AIIMS Bhubaneshwar stood first, KGMU Lucknow second and AIIMS Rishikesh, third.

If the days were filled with academic activity, the evenings were full of fun and frolic. Be it the welcome diner at Hotel tipsy town, grooving with the sound of percussions, or the Sufi flavour at the majestic gala dinner, at hotel Krishna Palace, there was something for everyone. With delectable delicacies, the sumptuous spread appealed to the palate of the food lovers, leaving a pleasant aftertaste to carry home. The highlight for the delegates was of-course the Ram Temple Visit. The visit had been facilitated by the conference organisers, with delegates getting an up- close view of the deity. Few of the delegates also visited the Mahakumbh at Prayagraj.

NABI BURNS CME 2025 – A Landmark Event in Patna

13th July 2025, Patna

Theme - “Eliminate & Educate”

On 13th July 2025, CME was conducted in Patna under the powerful theme “Eliminate & Educate”, aiming to spread knowledge, break myths, and promote excellence in the management of burn injuries. The CME was a proud collaboration between NABI (National Academy of Burns India) and the Bihar & Jharkhand Plastic Surgeons Association (BJPSA). The program brought together an enthusiastic and multidisciplinary crowd of plastic surgeons, MCh residents, nursing officers, physiotherapists, and dietitians, all united by a common cause — advancing burn care in India.

The event was led by a vibrant and committed team with **Dr. Veena Kumari Singh** as Organising Chairperson, **Dr. S. K. Gupta** as Organising Co-Chairperson, **Dr. Pranav Kumar** as Organising Secretary, **Dr. Kuldeep Singh & Dr. Setubandhu Tiwary** as Joint Organising Secretaries. Their tireless efforts translated into a meticulously coordinated event that struck the perfect balance between academic depth and practical relevance.

Synopsis of the Scientific Sessions

The scientific program was meticulously curated that span the entire continuum of burn care, from pre-hospital response to post-reconstructive rehabilitation. Under the theme “**Eliminate & Educate**,” the sessions combined cutting-edge knowledge, real-world application, and interdisciplinary collaboration.

The day began with foundational topics such as ‘What is Burns’ by **Dr. Veena Kumari Singh**, community awareness, prevention strategies, and pre-hospital care, led by experts including **Dr. Neela Bhattacharya (Siliguri)** and **Dr. B.P. Sarma (Guwahati)**, emphasising the crucial role of first responders.

This was followed by sessions on **emergency room and ICU management**, including fluid resuscitation, prognostication, and advanced dressing techniques. Notable speakers like **Dr. Prabhat Shrivastava (New Delhi)**, **Dr. Sujata Sarabahi (New Delhi)**, **Dr. Vinita Puri (Mumbai)**, and **Dr. Ramakant Bembde (Chh Sambhaji Nagar)** enriched the audience with their clinical wisdom.

Surgical management and innovation in wound care took centre stage next, with sessions on skin banking by **Dr. Smitha Segu (Bengaluru)**, dermal matrices, and acellular dermis applications by **Dr. Rajiv Agarwal (Lucknow)**, offering a peek into the future of tissue engineering and scar care. Later sessions explored **reconstruction challenges** such as neck contractures, electric burns, and microsurgical techniques, with contributions from **Dr. Vijay Kumar (Lucknow)**.

The day concluded with an engaging final session on **challenging burn cases and experience sharing**, where faculties reflected on complex scenarios and practical insights, fostering open discussion and peer learning.

He announced the upcoming establishment of skin banks across Bihar, a monumental step forward for the state's burn treatment ecosystem.

This highly engaging session emphasized the crucial role of fire prevention, preparedness, and first response — components that are often overlooked, yet fundamental to effective burn management.

Skin bank facility will be started soon in the state's medical colleges: Mangal Pandey

PATNA: Health Minister Mangal Pandey attended the national conference organized by National Academy of Burns India (NABI) on the subject of Educate and Eliminate here on Sunday in which senior doctors from different states of the country participated and gave their opinion.

In his address after the inaugural session, Health Minister Pandey said that this session is very important from the educational and scientific point of view. Where there is an opportunity to get acquainted with new advanced technology along with education. Usually, burn wounds in any part of the body have a bad effect not only physically but also men-



tally. In such a situation, social cooperation along with proper medical treatment and public awareness is necessary to deal with these problems. Our effort will be to further strengthen the burn units of hospitals across the state. On this occasion, the Health Minister made an important

announcement that the medical colleges of the state which have burn units, will soon be provided with skin bank facilities by the Health Department. Pandey said that getting treatment after a burn in any part of the body was a challenge. Several decades ago, the people of the state used to

struggle with these problems. But today, under the guidance of the Honorable Chief Minister Mr. Nitish Kumar, the health services of Bihar have been transformed. The number of burn units in the state has increased. Earlier, the state's largest government hospital, PMCH, did not have an ICU of the burn unit. But during my tenure, an ICU of the burn unit has been built in PMCH. Many types of facilities are being provided to patients in government facilities. The government is trying to resolve the problem of burns as soon as possible. The public should be made aware in this direction. This is very important. It is the responsibility of doctors to make people aware of these problems and the people of the society should

also come forward to help. Earlier, there was a shortage of government hospitals, but today the shortage of hospitals has also been removed.

Pandey said that for the first time in Bihar, a large-scale health fair was organized. Where thousands of patients took advantage of free medicine along with the examination of various diseases. This was a concrete step towards realizing the dream of a healthy Bihar, prosperous Bihar. "Health Fair 2025" was organized in the name of Jan Arogya Parv. Where entertainment was also arranged along with health benefits. Relieving stress with the help of music is also an important link during treatment. Whatever new hospitals are being built in

the state today. Music system has been arranged in every hospital there. Treatment can also be made effective by reducing the stress of the patient. It is the priority of the government that every victim gets respect and complete medical service. 20 burn units have been built in Bihar. Every victim gets treatment and respect, this is our medical service. The organizer of this program was Dr. Veena Singh, Head of Department of Plastic Surgery, AIIMS Patna. Apart from him, many senior doctors including Dr. Sujata Sarabahi, Dr. Smita, Dr. Vidyapati Chaudhary, Dr. Ashok Singh, Dr. BK Sharma, Dr. Pranav Kumar, Dr. Mukul Kumar Singh were present in the program.

NABI ZONAL BURNS CME MUMBAI - 10TH DECEMBER 2025

The NABI Midterm Continuing Medical Education (CME) –2025, west zone was successfully conducted on Wednesday, 10th December 2025, at the MLT Hall, Seth G.S. Medical College and KEM Hospital, Mumbai. The programme was organized by the Departments of Plastic Surgery and Community Medicine, Seth G.S. Medical College and KEM Hospital, under the aegis of the National Academy of Burns, India (NABI).

Dr. Venkateshwaran N. who is a former executive committee member of NABI and co-editor of Indian Journal of Burns served as the organising chairperson.

Dr. Vinita Puri – Professor and Head of the Department of Plastic Surgery at KEM Hospital, Mumbai, Past President of NABI and President of APSI along with Dr. Vijaykumar Singh – Professor and Head of the Department of Community Medicine at KEM Hospital, Mumbai, served as the senior advisors.

Dr. Joseph Francis and Dr. Prakhar Mathur - Assistant Professors in the Department of Plastic Surgery at KEM Hospital served as the Organising Secretaries for the CME.

The academic theme of the CME, “Burn Care – From First Response to Reintegration,” reflected a comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach to burn management, encompassing acute care, surgical intervention, rehabilitation, and community reintegration.

The CME was conceptualized as a single-day, high-impact academic programme and was open to a wide range of healthcare professionals, including medical officers, undergraduate medical students, interns, residents, nurses, therapists, and allied healthcare workers. The objective was to enhance both theoretical understanding and practical competency in burn care, particularly in resource-constrained and high-burden settings.

The morning scientific programme commenced with registration and welcome tea, followed by a series of focused didactic lectures delivered by an experienced and multidisciplinary faculty.

Topics covered included the epidemiology and burden of burns in India, principles of first response and golden hour management, referral and triage protocols, initial assessment of burn patients, pathophysiology and fluid resuscitation, pain management, acute burn wound care, surgical procedures in burn management, skin banking and tissue donation, and the role of community awareness and public health initiatives in burn prevention. The sessions were concise, evidence-based, and clinically oriented, ensuring relevance for participants across different levels of training and professional backgrounds.




Fig 5: Dr. Joseph Francis (Asst. Prof. Plastic Surgery – KEM Hospital)

Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy in Plastic Surgery, Burns and Inhalation Injury

Introduction

Plastic surgery is a specialty devoted to restoring both form and function in damaged or malformed structures of the body. The discipline spans a wide spectrum, including reconstructive surgery, microsurgery, hand surgery, and burn care. While acute wounds frequently respond well to operative management, chronic or non-healing wounds remain a persistent challenge. Such wounds require not only surgical expertise but also an understanding of wound biology and the application of scientifically validated adjunctive therapies

Among these adjuncts, Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) has emerged as a valuable modality. Initially met with scepticism, HBOT is now supported by a growing body of experimental and clinical evidence. Plastic surgeons are increasingly adopting this therapy to improve outcomes in ischemic and chronic wounds. Success, however, relies on careful patient selection, correct timing, and appropriate dosing tailored to tissue oxygenation parameters.

History of Hyperbaric Medicine

The roots of hyperbaric therapy lie in diving physiology. As early as 1834, Junod described the beneficial effects of pressurized oxygen. Later, Paul Bert's landmark text *La Pression Barométrique* (1878) established the therapeutic potential of oxygen at pressure, while also warning of oxygen toxicity risks. Subsequently, Haldane and Valenzuela investigated clinical uses, notably in carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

During the 20th century, major contributions from Hart, Strauss, Davis, Hunt, and Marx expanded the role of HBOT in trauma, chronic wounds, and osteonecrosis. The formation of international bodies such as the European Undersea Biomedical Society (1965) and the Undersea and Hyperbaric Medical Society (1967; renamed 1986) promoted scientific research and clinical standards. In China, hyperbaric medicine grew rapidly after the 1960s, with more than 5,000 operational chambers by 2013, reflecting its widespread clinical adoption.

Physiological Basis of HBOT

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBOT) involves breathing 100% oxygen at 2.0–2.5 ATA, greatly increasing plasma oxygen levels to enhance tissue oxygenation. It causes vasoconstriction to reduce edema, redistributes blood to ischemic areas, boosts immune and antibiotic effectiveness, reduces ischemia-reperfusion injury, and promotes healing through fibroblast growth, collagen production, angiogenesis, and epithelialization. HBOT is safe below 3 ATA.

Indications and Chamber Systems

The Undersea and Hyperbaric Medical Society (UHMS) lists 14 accepted indications for HBOT, including CO poisoning, decompression illness, gas embolism, clostridial myonecrosis, necrotizing infections, refractory osteomyelitis, compromised grafts, and burns. The European Committee for Hyperbaric Medicine (ECHM) provides evidence-based rankings, while the Chinese Medical Association (CMA) recognizes a broader set of emergency and elective uses. [Figure 1]

HBOT delivery systems include:

- Multiplace chambers: Pressurized with air, patients receive oxygen through hoods or masks. Staff can remain inside, allowing continuous monitoring of critically ill patients. However, they are costly and technically demanding.

- Monoplace chambers: Pressurized entirely with oxygen, these accommodate a single patient. They are cost-effective and user-friendly but less suitable for unstable patients requiring complex monitoring.

HBOT in Burns

Burn injuries produce both local and systemic consequences. Classically, the wound is divided into three zones: the zone of coagulation (irreversible necrosis), the zone of stasis (at risk but potentially salvageable), and the zone of hyperemia (expected to recover). During the first 24 hours, inflammation, oxidative stress, and ischemia–reperfusion injury frequently extend damage.

Early initiation of HBOT—ideally within six hours—is most beneficial. It reduces plasma leakage via precapillary vasoconstriction, maintains tissue oxygenation through increased plasma oxygen content, and helps preserve dermal structures [Figure 2]. HBOT also attenuates oxidative stress and reduces the risk of tissue necrosis. In burns complicated by smoke inhalation or CO poisoning, HBOT accelerates CO elimination and lowers the incidence of acute respiratory distress syndrome (ARDS).

Even beyond the acute phase, HBOT remains useful. By raising tissue oxygen tension, it suppresses anaerobic bacteria, augments neutrophil bactericidal function, and enhances the effectiveness of antibiotics such as aminoglycosides and fluoroquinolones. Furthermore, it promotes wound healing through fibroblast activity, collagen deposition, and angiogenesis—improving graft and flap survival, reducing infection, shortening hospital stays and lowering overall treatment costs. [Figure 3]

Inhalation Injury and Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Inhalation injury greatly worsens burn outcomes, often involving carbon monoxide (CO) and cyanide poisoning with airway damage. CO binds hemoglobin 250 times more strongly than oxygen, forming carboxyhemoglobin and impairing oxygen delivery, while also disrupting mitochondrial function and causing hypoxia. Diagnosis requires CO-oximetry, as pulse oximetry is unreliable. Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) is the treatment of choice in severe CO poisoning, reducing carboxyhemoglobin half-life to 22–35 minutes at 2–3 ATA. HBOT provides plasma-dissolved oxygen, mitigates reperfusion injury, protects neurons, reduces ARDS, and lowers neurocognitive risks. As an adjunct, it preserves tissue, enhances healing, and strengthens comprehensive burn management.

Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy in India: Experience, Evolution, and the Road Ahead

Institutional Experience

Over a three-year period (November 2011–November 2014), our center treated nearly 500 patients with Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) for both plastic surgery–related and non-surgical indications, including burns, diabetic foot ulcers, radiation injuries, and compromised grafts or flaps. Complications were uncommon, observed in only two patients. A 27-year-old male with 45% mixed-depth burns who had a central venous catheter inserted on admission. While the initial chest radiograph was unremarkable, he developed vague chest pain four days into HBOT. Imaging revealed a small pneumothorax, which was successfully managed with chest tube insertion, necessitating discontinuation of HBOT. A 67-year-old diabetic foot patient experienced transient myopia after 24 sessions, which resolved spontaneously within two weeks. These cases underscore the need for careful patient selection, thorough screening, and vigilant monitoring to ensure safety and optimize outcomes. Over a 14-year period, we treated a total of 1,140 patients with hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBO), including 500 patients with burns, and administered approximately 11,000 therapy sessions [FIGURE 4]

Evolution of Hyperbaric Medicine in India

Early Phase (1965–2000)

The history of HBOT in India began in 1968, when the Mumbai Port Trust introduced the first hyperbaric chamber, often described as resembling an “oyster clam shell.” Subsequent developments included a monoplace recompression chamber in 1977 and a multiplace chamber in 1983 at the Institute of Naval Medicine, Indian Navy. The earliest symposium addressing diving and physiological problems at sea was held in Cochin in 1967, focusing largely on naval and occupational exposures. During this phase, HBOT centers were almost exclusively associated with defence hospitals. The therapy was largely confined to indications such as decompression sickness and gas gangrene, and awareness among civilian clinicians was minimal. For most medical students and practitioners, HBOT remained a little-known modality with limited perceived clinical utility.

Intermediate Phase (2000–2010)

The landscape began to shift in 2000, when Dr. Tarun Sahni, formerly with the Navy, established the first private hospital-based multiplace chamber at Apollo Hospital, New Delhi. This marked a pivotal moment, as HBOT entered mainstream civilian practice. Although growth remained slow, new centers emerged intermittently, bringing HBOT into focus for chronic wounds, cerebral edema, and radiation-induced tissue injury. Evidence from these centers gradually demonstrated that HBOT could have a broader scope in Indian clinical practice than previously appreciated.

Current & Post Covid Phase (2011–2025)

The last decade has seen accelerated, albeit unregulated, growth of HBOT facilities in India. Centers have been established within private hospitals and are managed by diverse specialists including physicians, intensivists, and orthopaedic surgeons. Importantly, in 2011, Jubilee Mission Hospital, Thrissur, Kerala, established the first medical HBOT unit led by plastic surgeons, integrating the therapy with burns and reconstructive surgery. This alignment allowed HBOT to be used in large volumes of burn patients, compromised flaps, and chronic wound care. [FIGURE 5] The institution initiated the use of a multiplace hyperbaric oxygen (HBO) chamber in September 2025, enabling the provision of services to multiple patients simultaneously and thereby enhancing the efficiency and accessibility of HBO therapy [FIGURE 6].

Parallel to clinical adoption, India also witnessed growth in the occupational use of hyperbaric medicine, particularly due to tunnelling projects for metro rail systems across major cities. Despite this, the diving medicine component has remained relatively underdeveloped compared to countries with strong leisure diving industries.

Currently, there are about 60 HBOT centers in India. Following the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been a notable resurgence in the establishment of hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBOT) centers, particularly to cope with post-inflammatory fibrosis of the lungs. Prior to the pandemic, only 25 centers were operational; however, this number has increased to 60 centers in the post-COVID era, reflecting an enhanced focus on managing pulmonary sequelae such as post-inflammatory fibrotic changes. This number is modest when compared with countries like China (5000 centers), Japan (1000 centers), and Taiwan (200 centers), reflecting the need for structured growth and policy development in India.

Challenges in Plastic Surgery Integration

Despite increasing availability, HBOT in India remains underutilized in plastic and reconstructive surgery. Historically, referrals often occurred late, when ischemic extremities, digits, or flaps had already progressed to gangrene, diminishing the potential benefits of therapy. This pattern has perpetuated the misconception that HBOT is ineffective.

For HBOT to gain wider acceptance, three key challenges must be addressed:

1. Proper patient selection – Identifying indications where HBOT has proven benefit.
2. Timely initiation – Early integration into treatment protocols rather than as a last resort.
3. Proper cessation – Avoiding unnecessarily prolonged or inappropriate courses.

These principles form a “tripod approach,” requiring education of referring clinicians, evidence-based acceptance criteria by HBOT centers, and public awareness campaigns to enhance understanding and demand for the therapy.

The Road Ahead

Research and Evidence Building

The global HBOT literature is replete with conflicting reports, partly due to variability in study design and accessibility of non-English publications from Asia and South America. To strengthen the evidence base in India, multicenter trials are essential. Collaborative studies can generate data relevant to Indian patients, enabling formulation of national guidelines and a standardized code of practice.

Future research priorities include:

- Evaluating HBOT in microsurgical flaps, particularly in preventing ischemia-reperfusion injury.
- Investigating molecular markers (e.g., p53, p21WAF-1, Bax protein) to better understand the cellular response to HBOT.
- Designing pragmatic clinical studies that balance methodological rigor with ethical feasibility in surgical settings.

Training and Education

Globally, HBOT is recognized as a specialty discipline, often pursued by physicians with primary training in surgery, critical

care, or emergency medicine. Structured training programs, such as those certified by the Undersea and Hyperbaric Medical Society (UHMS), are available in the United States but remain absent in India. Currently, Indian physicians must travel abroad for certification.

Establishing local training initiatives, beginning with short courses for plastic surgeons and other specialists, is critical. Such programs would not only expand knowledge but also encourage integration of HBOT into surgical practice.

Innovative Learning Platforms

Given the limited number of centers in India (~25 compared with 3,000 in China), exposure to HBOT during medical education is minimal. To bridge this gap, novel strategies such as mobile learning applications can be employed. Micro-modules in the form of short videos, infographics, case studies, and periodic notifications can sustain interest and promote self-paced learning. Such digital tools can serve as an entry point, ultimately leading interested clinicians toward structured, hands-on training.

Integration into Wound Care

Plastic surgeons routinely manage conditions for which HBOT has established efficacy, including burns, chronic wounds, diabetic ulcers, and radiation injuries. Establishing multidisciplinary wound healing centers, captained by plastic surgeons and integrated with HBOT facilities, represents an optimal strategy. This approach not only broadens access but also ensures that HBOT is applied appropriately, enhancing outcomes for complex wounds.

Establishing a Professional Body

India currently lacks a dedicated professional organization for HBOT. Creating such a body, ideally under governmental oversight, would enable development of guidelines, accreditation standards, and policy frameworks. Collaboration with international societies, such as the Asian Pacific Undersea and Hyperbaric Society, can facilitate academic exchange and accelerate India's progress in this field.

Conclusion

Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy in India has evolved from a naval and occupational focus to a growing clinical modality with relevance across multiple medical and surgical specialties. While significant progress has been made over the past two decades, challenges remain in awareness, accessibility, regulation, and evidence generation.

Plastic surgery, with its central role in managing burns, flaps, grafts, and chronic wounds, is uniquely positioned to spearhead the integration of HBOT into mainstream clinical practice. Success will depend on timely referrals, structured training, robust research, and national-level policy frameworks.

By combining institutional experiences, multicenter collaboration, and innovative learning approaches, India can build a strong foundation for HBOT. With proper planning, this adjunctive therapy can evolve from a “last resort” option into a mainstay of multidisciplinary care, offering measurable benefits to patients across the country.


Figure 3: Paediatric second degree burn injury heals at a faster rate with HBO administration – heals within 7 days of injury than usual 21day

Obituary



Dr. D L N Prasad

“The rare Casuarina Bonsaree, worth approximately Rs 1.5 lakh, was stolen from the house of former Director-General of Police V. Appa Rao in the Jubilee Hills area on Monday.”-India Today Newspaper reported on January 15, 2021.

Dr. Prasad is the Founder of Plastic Surgery at Osmania and also in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. Apart from his stature as a surgeon and Bonsai expert, he is known for his discipline and moral principles. “He is a man of ethics and norms even when dealing with pressures from the government. He always fought for the welfare of his patients. In his illustrious career as a reconstructive surgeon, he treated thousands of patients with tender love and dignity, and they consider him as a walking GOD on earth. His commitment and honesty should be emulated by every physician” comments his daughter Usha. “ He comes from an agricultural family and believes that hobbies and nature reduce stress”, she adds. No wonder he developed a hobby that involved nature and farming.

He was born in 1935 in Tenali, A.P. into a family of farmers. He had his primary and secondary education in Madras and joined Andhra Medical College in 1955. He obtained an M.S. in General Surgery from AMC in 1962 and worked as an Assistant Professor at Gandhi Medical College from 1964-69. Subsequently, he started his training in Plastic Surgery at Safdarjung Hospital, Delhi in 1969 under Dr. J.L. Gupta, a renowned Plastic and reconstructive surgeon. Dr. Gupta worked closely with Dr. Chakkiri Balakrishnan, the Father of Plastic Surgery in modern India, at the Plastic and Maxillofacial Surgery unit created at the Medical College of Nagpur on 16th December 1957. After completing his M.Ch in Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, Dr. Prasad joined the Osmania General Hospital as an O.P. Medical Officer. Inspired by Dr. C. Balakrishnan, his vision was to build a Plastic Surgery unit at Osmania General Hospital, which was to become the first such unit in Andhra Pradesh. With persistent efforts and networking with others who believed in his abilities and skills, OGH saw the First Plastic Surgery unit erected in 1972, with 34 beds for burns patients and 18 for plastic surgery. There was no separate operating theater or staff for Plastic Surgery patients. There were no separate OTs, wards, or staff for the plastic surgery. He had to share the facilities and equipment with other established specialties like Neurosurgery, Cardiothoracic and Vascular Surgery, and General Surgery and faced intense opposition from them while performing surgeries for cleft lip, cleft palate, and burns.

In 1986, 15 years after the Plastic Surgery Unit was established, postgraduate training was approved at OGH. Dr. Prasad used to collect photographs of clinical cases for effective teaching of his students. He worked closely with Dr. Raghava Reddy and performed nearly a hundred Narayan Flap reconstructions and hundreds of cleft works at OGH. The results were presented by the postgraduate students and Faculty of OGH at various national and international Plastic Surgery Conferences. Many well-recognized Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery specialists were trained at OGH under Dr. Prasad’s guidance. “He was so meticulous and graceful, no wonder he loves roses and Bonsai,” recalls one of his anesthesia colleagues. Dr. Prasad was also instrumental in establishing the Microvascular Surgery at the Nizam’s Institute of Medical Sciences. One of the remarkable accomplishments of Dr. Prasad is the Bonsai Garden concept that he envisioned and cultivated at Hyderabad. He applied his marvelous plastic surgery skills to the plant kingdom and created his magnificent Bonsai Garden with more than 200 priceless Bonsai plants. He is known to be the catalyst behind the Bonsai Garden in Ramoji Film City. He also started the Rose Society, and the Bonsai Society in Hyderabad and has been conducting Society of Bombay, Visakhapatnam, and Chennai He is frequently visited by Peter Chan, a Master
